Quick Look 2017-2018*

Length of Program: 36 units; 3 semesters full-time, part time options available. Addition of an optional concentration increases length of program- 30 unit degree option for dual MA in Counseling Ministry/MS in Counseling Psychology

Approximate Cost: \$580 per unit, \$20,880 without optional concentrations plus \$355 per semester general fee

Program Starts: Fall (September), Spring (January), Summer (May)

Priority Deadline: Application completion dates; Fall-April 1, Spring-November 1, Summer-March 1

Standard Deadline: Application completion dates; Fall-August 1, Spring- December 1, Summer-April 1

Program Format: Courses typically offered Monday thru Thursday @ 4pm and/or 7pm

GPA Requirement: 2.75. Low GPA may be overcome w/satisfactory GRE score

GRE Requirement: GRE **not** required for applicants who meet GPA requirement

Accreditation: Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC)

Application Requirements

1. Application for admission with a \$45 non-refundable application fee. Apply at www.calbaptist.edu/gradapp.
2. Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution or the evaluated equivalency, with a minimum GPA of 2.75. Applicants with a GPA below 2.75 may be considered for admission
3. Official transcripts showing completion of a baccalaureate degree; sent to *Graduate Admissions*. Additional transcripts may be required to verify prerequisites or GPA.
4. Three recommendations. It is preferred that one recommendation be from a professor or instructor. Family and friends may not complete recommendations.
5. Comprehensive essay of at least 500 words that includes the following:
 - Purpose for entering the program
 - Experiences that have directed your interest toward becoming a counseling minister
 - Religious background, present pattern of spiritual growth, fundamentals of personal faith and the relationship between your faith and professional goals
 - Reasons for choosing to study at CBU
 - Influences that have shaped your present values and approach to life
 - A response to this question, "Have you ever received psychiatric treatment or counseling, yes or no?" If yes, please provide a brief explanation.

6. Successful interview(s) with the Director of the Graduate Program in Counseling Ministry
7. An applicant whose first language is not English and/or does not have a degree from an institution where English is the primary language of instruction is required to demonstrate English proficiency.
test score from Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS).
