Fire Extinguisher Use Guidelines



Your safety and the safety of others is always first priority. Before attempting to extinguish any fire, ensure there is a safe exit path <u>and</u> someone has been directed to activate the alarm and contact California Baptist University Department of Public Safety at *951.343.4311*. Department of Public Safety will determine if the fire department must be contacted. Only attempt to extinguish fires if the following conditions exist:

- **1.** The fire is still in its beginning or initial stage and may be extinguished with a single fire extinguisher. It is best to evacuate if the fire is rapidly spreading.
- **2.** The entire fire is visible and the materials burning are known. Fires that may have spread from another area may appear to be small; however the unseen portion of fire may be larger than expected.

DO NOT attempt to extinguish a fire if:


- 1. You do not feel comfortable extinguishing the fire. It is better to evacuate than extinguish a fire without confidence in your ability to use a fire extinguisher.
- 2. Extinguishing the fire may potentially trap you leaving you without an exit path.
- **3.** Attempting to extinguish the fire will put you in risk of additional hazards.
- **4.** There is a significant amount of smoke and/or fumes.

Using the Extinguisher

The simple, yet effective, acronym **PASS** is all you need to remember while using a fire extinguisher to extinguish a fire.

Pull the pin

Aim at the base of the fire

Squeeze the lever or trigger

Sweep side to side

After Extinguishing a Fire

California Baptist University Department of Public Safety (DPS) must be notified even if the fire has been extinguished. Once a fire has been extinguished, ensure the area is not left unattended, unless doing so further endangers personnel, for *approximately 30 minutes or until DPS and/or the Fire Department* has determined the fire has been 100% extinguished.
