What is Construction Management?

Construction Management (CM) students require a broad background in construction methods and materials, project management, and business administration. The CM program is designed to prepare students for all facets of the construction industry.

How are Construction Managers different from Architects and Engineers?

Construction Managers are part of the team responsible for the construction of a building or other facilities. Architects and engineers are typically contracted by to provide the design, while the construction management team is responsible for means and methods. Architects and engineers work together to produce design of building/facility such as Building information models (BIM), blueprints and specifications. The construction team estimates, schedules, and supervises the execution of the work based on the design provided by architects and engineers. More and more, all these groups work together with the owner in an integrated project delivery process to build a particular project.



What sort of courses will I take?

Our goal at California Baptist University (CBU) is to make sure that graduates from the CM program are the best qualified candidate in starting your career. The CM program at CBU helps their students through balanced education for faith, leadership and technical competence.

The CM curriculum includes general education and critical thinking skills necessary for a successful career in construction, with a broad background in the liberal arts, mathematics, and the physical sciences.



Freshman through senior years in the CM program are focused on the technical and managerial aspects of the construction field including materials, computer-aided drafting and modeling, plan reading, estimating, scheduling, surveying, building mechanical and electrical systems, project management, finance and safety. Our accounting, and program emphasizes the use of advanced computing technologies managing construction for operations.

In addition, the Gordon and Jill Bourns College of Engineering and the CBU require courses for leadership and team collaboration skills and Bible-based courses in Christian studies.

What kind of job will I get after college?

CBU CM students are in demand for a variety of positions in the commercial, residential, heavy civil and specialty construction. Graduates are
