

Re: Compliance with HEA Title I, Section 120 relating to Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention

Requires that the institution determine the number of drug and alcohol-related incidents and fatalities occurring on campus, or as part of an institution's activities, that are reported to campus officials; and the number and type of sanctions imposed as a result of such incidents and fatalities. Additionally, requires that each student, upon enrollment, receive a separate, clear and conspicuous written notice with information on the penalties associated with drug related offenses under existing section 484(r) of the HEA; and provide timely notice to each student who has lost eligibility for a grant, loan, or work-study assistance as a result of penalties under 484(r) of the HEA on the way to regain eligibility under section 484(r)(2) of the HEA.

- The Department of Public Safety has modified its information collection procedures to comply with the mandate to determine the number of drug and alcohol-related incidents and fatalities occurring on campus or as part of the University's activities.
- The Dean of Students collects information on the number and type of sanctions imposed as a result of such incidents and fatalities.
- The CBU Student Handbook has been modified to provide information on the penalties associated with drug and alcohol related offenses, including the potential loss of eligibility for any grant, loan, or work study assistance program.
- A notice has been prepared to provide timely notice to each student who has lost eligibility for any grant, loan, or work study assistance as a result of penalties under 484(r)(1) of the HEA. The notice advises the student of the loss of eligibility and describes the ways in which, eligibility may be regained.
